
Serving as a U. S. Army Air Force Flight Instructor during WWII, Lt. Elmer Goldthwaite Raymond, the son of Elmer and Alice Raymond, lost his life while on a training mission near Columbia, Alabama. Named in his honor, this park is also known as the "Scout Lot" because this popular young man from Pelham was an avid member of the Boy Scouts of America and 4H Clubs.

Please keep in mind this is park is public property and as such you may run into non-scouters and park patrols. Please be considerate and act scout-like at all times. Please practice Leave No Trace and leave this natural gift cleaner than we find it. Bring a trash bag with you and if you see something that someone left behind please feel free to carry it out.

The park entrance is off Keyes Hill Rd. about 1/4 mile west of Mammoth Rd. Look for the wooden sign on the left if coming from Mammoth Rd.

Enter the park just at the entrance sign and park in the paved parking lot. This lot is maintained in winter. Immediately adjacent to the parking lot is a building used by various youth groups. The building is not open to the public.

The open grassy area abutting the parking area is used for soccer during the season. The park has many trails and lends itself to on or off trail walking, hiking, cross-country skiing, and the like. The ground varies from relatively flat to fairly steep so there is terrain for everyone. Hunting is prohibited.
